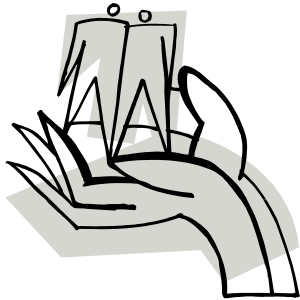


The Stewardship of Service

Ideas for Christian Service

1. Receive God's Gifts Gratefully

Realize that you possess gifts and talents. Sharing your talents through service develops and utilizes the skills that God has given to you as pure gift. Search out the talents you possess, nurture them, and help them grow. Everybody has skills. Everybody can have a role in the service of God and in the work of the church. **In the words of the late Mother Theresa of Calcutta,**

“The Call of Christianity is not always to do Monumental and extraordinary things, but To do the ordinary things of everyday life Well and with love.”

2. Cultivate your Gifts Responsibly

Assess your life as it exists in the present moment. Look at your status single or married, with or without children. Examine all the people you come into contact with on a daily basis, family, co-workers, community, and parish and the varied ways that you serve others. Jesus calls each of us to a life of service, not because someone has a need to receive, but because we have a need to give.

3. Share Your Gifts Lovingly and in Justice with Others

Take action – call the parish for ideas on how you can serve others. As we share our gifts, they multiply enriching our lives and the lives of the people around us. The Stewardship of Service successfully bridges the material world around us and the world of the Spirit within us.
